4/1	<p>To Receive any Declarations of Interest from Members/Dispensations</p> <p>Cllr. Morris declared an interest in the allotments.</p>	
5/1	<p>Allow up to 15 Minutes for the Public to address the Council</p> <p>Due to the large number of people present with regard to their interest in planning application PA23/00102, the Chair deferred this item and said he would be amending the order of the agenda in order to allow time for views to be heard on this application.</p>	
6/1	<p>Update in person from PCSO Edser</p> <p>PCSO Edser attended the meeting and provided an update. He said the disclosable crimes in the St Cleer area were: a public order offence in St Cleer and a dog attack in Darite. He continued by saying that since Dec 30th 2022 there had also been one report of criminal damage to a car. There had been recent reports of fuel thefts and catalytic converters. There had also been reports of quad bikes going missing. PCSO Edser advised residents to make regular checks on their fuel and said that with rising prices he expected there might be more fuel thefts. He continued by saying he had no update regarding whether the Liskeard station would have a front counter desk open to the public. He finished by reminding the public that they can ring 101 or e-mail 101@dc.police.uk to report non-emergency incidents/ crimes, and should dial 999 for emergencies.</p>	
7/1	<p>Update From Cornwall Councillor, P. Seeva</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i) Mayor – No update on the Mayor for Cornwall yet. C.Cllr. Seeva said that he himself was undecided on the matter as the debate hadn't yet been held. ii) Spaceport – he commented on the positive media coverage of Cornwall regarding this major project. iii) Second Homes – C.Cllr. Seeva said the increased rate on second homes wasn't definite yet as it hadn't had Royal Assent. iv) Penhale Lane – he said he had met with the portfolio holder and expressed concern at the long delays to this development and mentioned the contacts he'd received from residents desperate to move in. Cllr. Johnson said the whole situation was a disaster and was disgraceful. Cllr. C. Seeva agreed that it was very frustrating. He will continue to push this matter.
