#### Some crime updates this month

A 31 year old man from St Neot has been Charged with criminal damage and breaching his Criminal Behaviour Order.

A 27 year old woman has been Summoned to court for burglary with a shoplifting and two attempted frauds taken into consideration

A 25 year old man has been Charged with criminal damage following a domestic abuse report

A 27 year old man has been Cautioned for assaulting another male with punches to the face

A 47 year old woman has been given a Penalty Notice for being drunk and disorderly and verbally abusive in the street

A 63 year old man has been summoned to Court for a series of public order offences in the town centre. A Criminal Behaviour Order is being applied for through the Court

A 68 year old man has been dealt with by way of Community Resolution following a neighbour dispute which led to an assault

A 25 year old man has been given a Fixed Penalty Notice for shoplifting at Trago Mills and banned from the store

Cornwall has a new Commander with the appointment of Chief Superintendent Jim Pearce in January who is responsible for crime and community policing in the County. He's been with the force for 15 years and held many roles, most recently the Commander for West Cornwall. He says, "I'm really looking forward to this exciting new challenge and I intend to build on the existing good work and practice already taking place around the County to ensure Cornwall remains one of the safest places to live and visit."

## Drink drive results are in

Figures have been released for Devon and Cornwall Police's Christmas drink and drug driving campaign 2015. Police officers administered a total of 1974 breath tests of which 177 were positive, refused or failed to provide. This represents 9% of the total and is a usual level of offending behaviour detected.

For the first time Devon & Cornwall officers have been able to screen drivers, who they suspect may have consumed controlled drugs prior to or whilst driving, at the roadside with an approved reliable device. 11 drug wipes tests were carried out with 4 resulting in a positive result.

Sgt Williams said: "We know that the presence of illegal drugs are a contributor to fatal and serious injury road traffic collisions, and the ability to arrest and prosecute impaired offenders will help us to keep the road using communities of Devon and Cornwall safer."
