NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

PUBLIC MEETING.

St Cleer Parish Council wishes to advise you that there will be a public meeting, on Tuesday, the 17th May, 2016, in the Memorial Hall, St Cleer at 6.30 pm.. The purpose of the meeting is to update all Parish residents on the Neighbourhood Plan and the next steps. Also to answer any concerns or questions, you might have.

The Neighbourhood Plan will be looking at all aspects that impact on life in St Cleer and the adjoining parishes. To achieve this, it is important that as wide a consultation is sought as possible. It is recognised that there will be varied opinions and these will all need to be considered.

The Parish Council is the Commissioning body, and has delegated the Steering Group to action the Neighbourhood Plan. We now need to seek volunteers for this role, this is an important task as the completed report will have long term effects on St Cleer, and adjoining areas.

This meeting will fully explain the role, and seek suitable candidates, local people who want to be part of creating a plan that will benefit our community. It is hoped that this will include school children, teenagers, families, right through to the 'older generation'. What we like in our community and what we would like to change.

As a guide, the structure of the evening would be as follows.....

- Introduction of those present and their roles
- Brief outline of where we are in the process.
- Parish Council's Role in the Neighbourhood Plan.
- Steering Group's Role
- Resident's Role
- Proposal on how to involve "everyone".
- Consultation and communication as plan progresses.

Question and Answer session. Main focus to be on what we are going to do, the need to ensure the plan has good local support so the final draft is supported by as many as possible of the local residents.....all of us!

We need to realise this is a big task, we all need to be flexible in our expectations. This is a democratic process, and the final plan has to be ratified by all of the residents in St Cleer Parish, prior to being submitted to Cornwall Council
